After that point she will no longer be checking or responding to emails, calls or texts. Rev. If there is a crisis or death in the congregation the consulting minister, Rev. Sara will determine if Rev. Amy needs to know and what response, if any, will be appropriate.

What is a sabbatical?:

Sabbaticals are designed to foster rest, reflection, and renewal, a respite in depth, to provide an opportunity to break away from established routine and the press of heavy responsibilities, a chance to experience different cultures and be stimulated by new learnings, and time and space to reflect on the meaning of it all. Sabbaticals are not extended vacations nor tightly structured, highly focused study leaves, though sabbaticals often include study and/or travel and provide the opportunity not only for formal learning and cultural enrichment but also time for receptivity and reflection. Receptivity opens the way to interior healing, fresh insight and perspective, and possibly a new energy that is less driven, more balanced and productive.

Help while Rev. Amy is away:

Sabbatical Consulting Minister (Rev. Sara Hayman from Ellsworth)

August through December

Rev. Sara will be a resource for only the church leadership to access for any complicated or pressing questions/situations. The consulting minister will attend three meetings per month: the Council business meeting, the COM (Committee on Ministry) meeting and the Staff meeting. She's available to consult with staff members, COM members, and Council members. She will also be in contact with the Chair of the Caring Circle or her designee, to coordinate pastoral care emergencies if needed. She will preach two times while Rev. Amy is away.

Sabbatical Worship Coordinator Position (Cayla Miller)

August through December. The Worship Coordinator will manage the logistics of contacting the already scheduled guest ministers in advance of their service, connecting them with their worship associate and other appropriate people including tech and music folks. She will help to make sure they get their materials in on time, and have a correct order of worship. Cayla will manage these communications and be the point person for our guests and worship associates as they put together each week's service. She will also send out the weekly Sunday emails.

Kerri Vacher remains chair of Worship Arts and will continue to convene their meetings and plan worship where needed.
